



Indonesian Christian Church

History:

Through a unification process started in 1962, the Indonesian Christian Church of Central Java unified with the Indonesian Christian Church of West Java (established in 1940) and the Indonesian Christian Church of East Java (established in 1934) in 1988. All the churches were founded among the Chinese immigrants (Ho Kien, Hok Chia and Khe Ren) in Indonesia. After the full unification, the church is now known as the Indonesian Christian Church (Gereja Kristen Indonesia, GKI) and it has become a multi-ethnic church.

Activities:

The mission work of GKI is done through, among others, education systems, community health care, orphanage, elderly housings, funeral services and publishing. Concerning GKI's involvement in education, it has now two universities in Jakarta and Bandung (West Java), one big school system (with 118 schools) in Jakarta, Banten and West Java, and many local church schools. In the community health care, many congregations have their own health clinics serving the people in the surroundings.



The Indonesian Christian Church currently has over 206,000 members.
