



Protestant Christian Church in Bali

History:

The Protestant Christian Church in Bali began in the 1930s through the overseas missionary work of the Christian Church of East Java and Netherlands Reformed Church. During WWII the congregations grew and were formed across a large portion of the island. The church did not consider itself fully autonomous until 1948 when the first synod met. Significant developments took place after 1950 when the church contextualized the gospel in the local culture of Bali through architecture, symbols and teaching.

Activities:

Through traditional arts, dancing and music, the church is engaged in the development program of the government. The spiritual formation department is helping people to grow mature in spirituality. The diaconia department is assisting people to be self-sufficient economically and the mission department provides people with education. The Dhyana Pura Institutions are used to assist local people to live responsibly in the island of tourism.



The Protestant Christian Church in Bali currently has over 12,000 members.
